HENRY TAYLOR: B SIDE, January 18th

Combining immediacy *and* tenderness, L.A.–based artist <u>Henry Taylor</u> (b. 1958) portrays the everyday life of his Black American community... only that this includes incarceration, poverty, and deadly interactions with police. Steeped in art history, his work represents a continuum with the politically engaged figurative work of European and American artists from Max Beckmann to Alice Neel.



ED RUSCHA: NOW THEN, February 29th

In 1956, Ruscha (when 19 years old) left his Oklahoma hometown to drive Interstate Highway 66, studying and drawing inspiration from roadside architecture, everyday speech, and pop culture. He returned in later years to revisit motifs, sites, and signs while drawing from the continuous reinvention that has defined his work.
